Lent is said to have been formalized by the first council of Nicaea in 325 ce.

It is a period of 40 days of fasting, prayer and commemoration of the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ the Son of God. The Lenten season is a special occasion in which Christians reflect on what it is to be a Christian and to show gratitude to what Jesus Christ has done for us on the cross. The 40 days period was said to have been insinuated by Pope Leo I in the 5th century. Let's take a journey back into the days of the bible, shall we? Before lent was even celebrated did you know that Jesus was the first person to celebrate Lent? Before Jesus began his ministry, he went into the desert spending 40 days and nights without food or water. When the 40 days were over, he was weakened and hungry. The devil Satan tempted him three times but Jesus succeeded in not giving into temptation.

Then place each on their respective pocket.

The ideas is to have the children pick up 3 strips of paper in the morning, one from each pocket, with the goal to accomplish them by the end of the day! Then the next day to pick up other three! Like that they can have a little sacrifice and an offering to give until the end of the 40 days of Lent:)
